Science

- Recognise that living things produce offspring and that this offspring can vary.
- Recognise that living things have changed over time and that fossils provide us with information about living things that inhabited the earth millions of years ago.

- Study Darwin's work on Galapagos finches and what this showed him.

History

- •Show understanding of a non-European society (The Mayans)
- Make links between some of the features of Ancient Greeks / Romans and The Mayans (religion, culture, beliefs).
- Investigate their own line of enquiry by choosing an aspect of Mayan culture and researching it.
- •Identify and compare changes within and across time periods.
- Facts and opinions.
- Investigate own lines of enquiry.
- Order events chronologically on a timeline.
- Identify, compare and contrast changes across different time periods.
- •Learn about Mayan legends (The Hero Twins)

Literacy

- Unpick the features of a set of instructions, discussing why they are used and how they are helpful.
- Produce a set of instructions for making Mayan hot chocolate.
- •Show an understanding of the language used in instructions (imperative verbs, switch from informal to formal tone and back again).
- Identify the features of an adventure story, looking at an opening, dilemma, resolution and conclusion.
- •Use cohesive devices to make their writing flow.
- Choose vocabulary wisely and make use of a thesaurus.
- Plan, produce, edit and redraft an adventure story of their choosing.
- Identify what makes an explanation text different to other genres of writing.
- Produce an alternative explanation text, using the correct features (fronted adverbials, modal verbs, cohesive devices, chronology, introductory paragraph, concluding paragraph).
- Produce a formal, concise newspaper report.
- Use passive voice and subjunctive form to make their writing formal.
