

## St. Mary's News 8th September 2023





A great BIG WELCOME BACK to everyone. It is lovely to see you all once again and we hope that you have had a lovely summer.

The children have settled in really well and there are lots of smiling and happy faces. Lots of them say that they are pleased to be back and that they have missed their friends.



The staff are delighted with how well the children have adapted to the new routines and expectations of their new classes and they are really proud of how hard the children are working. They have all made great first impressions. Keep it up children.

We know that picking up at home time is taking a little longer than normal, particularly from the Infant classrooms, but we ask you to be patient whilst staff get to know the faces of the new parents/carers/grandparents or other family members and friends who are

collecting the children.



To help ease the congestion at the Y1/Y2 doors, can parents/carers please collect the Y1/2 children first before collecting any older, junior siblings as having junior siblings at the Y1/2 doors is adding to the numbers around the classrooms.

For safeguarding purposes, our infant children are only released to named adults and a password system is used with our Reception children if the staff do not recognise the adult collecting the child.

All children will only be released to another parent if written permission or permission via a phone call, to school, has been given.

Please remember that staff are not being difficult—they are keeping the children safe.





We would like to say a big welcome to our new Reception children and their families who became members of our school community this week. The children have been absolute super stars and have settled in amazingly well.



They are a lovely group and we are very excited to start their learning journeys with them.

### Keeping up to Date with Events/Routines/News in School

Our school year is always very busy and the easiest way of keeping up to date with events/news is by reading the weekly newsletter. It is published on the school's website under the newsletter tab (www.bstm.co.uk) every Friday. We also use the newsletter to share the children's achievements with you.

Every class also has a class page on the website. Staff will inform you of any class events/timetables/news on this page. They will also upload photographs of the children's work or the children at work for you to see.



#### Healthy School/Healthy Snacks

Can we please ask that only healthy snacks are sent into school with the children to have at break time e.g. fruit, cheese, yoghurt etc. and that biscuits and crisps are avoided. To limit the risk of choking, grapes should be cut in half length ways.



Toast is available for all children and can be ordered through School Money. If your child has toast, no other snack is needed as the children only have a short time to eat their snack before break.

Juice should also not be brought into school. Water or flavoured water is fine. Please ensure water bottles are labelled.

As we are a nut free environment, snacks containing nuts <u>or</u> traces of nuts are also not permitted. We have children in school with serious nut allergies that require treatment via an epi pen. Please do not send in cereal bars or any other items that list nuts or traces of nuts on them as your child will not be able to open/eat them.



#### Own Clothes for Birthdays

Don't forget that the children can come to school in their own clothes on their birthday in order to mark their special day. If their birthday is on the weekend, they can come to school in their own clothes on a Monday. If their birthday is during a holiday period, the children can wear their own clothes on the first day back after the holiday period.

## Earrings Reminder

Can we please remind you that for health and safety reasons, earrings are not to be worn to school — even with plasters over them. If you are worried about the piercing closing over, then clear plastic earring retainers can be worn in their place. From Monday, you will be asked to come into school to take out your child's earrings if they come into school with them in.

#### Jewellery Reminder

Watches are the only jewellery permitted to be worn in school. Necklaces, friendship bracelets etc are not to be worn. Thank you.

# Charges for the Half-Term

Many parents prefer to pay for lunches etc for the half-term rather than on a weekly basis. Please see costings below. All money must be paid using the School Money App.

A separate letter has been emailed home to explain about the Levy charge. Please note that this payment is a one off annual payment.

Please note that the price of school meals is due to rise—price increases will most likely occur be after the October half-term.



# School Payments School Money



We are currently experiencing technical difficulties with the School Money App—mainly around children being moved up to their new classes and this means that you are unable to access your school accounts.

Please don't worry about not being able to pay for school meals, toast etc. This will be sorted once the system is back up and running.

We will send out a message once it is fixed.



Whilst School Money is currently not working, please ring the office or email school to book your child/ren into ABC. Payments can be made once the system is back up and running.

If paying by childcare vouchers, you are unable to use the system to book in (even when the system is working) so please email school the days and times needed and staff will enter your bookings.

Please note that the system does not allow 'on the day' bookings, so if you need to book a place at short notice, then please email or phone school.

#### Extra-Curricular Clubs

Our extra-curricular, sporting clubs start again next week and will run for 6 weeks with the final Wednesday club being on Wednesday 18th October and the Friday clubs being 20th October.

KS2 Children do not need football boots or a football kit to play in. They will play in trainers and will already have their PE Kits on. If it is wet, sessions will be held indoors.

The Y1/2 Multisport Club offers the children the opportunity to play/take part in a range of sporting activities over the 6 weeks.

Our new Reception children will be able to attend a sporting club after the October half-term, once they have settled in.

If your child needs to attend ABC following the club, they will be taken across by the coaches and will be charged for the 4.30 - 5.30pm slot.

Reception parents/carers once the children have settled into school.


