
Every week, one of our Influencers will recommend a book for others to read, so look out for their recommendations in our weekly newsletter.

We say goodbye to Hilary—our school cook today, as she is hanging up her apron, pots and pans to retire.


Hilary has been our school cook for seven years, but has worked in other schools within the LA for the last 28 years!
