

#### Billinge Christmas Tree Festival


St Aidan's Church are holding a Christmas Tree Festival, once again this year. The festival will run over the 8th, 9th and 10th December.

Our Y5/6 choir members have been invited to sing with the other Billinge schools at the opening of the festival on Friday 8th December at 10.00am. Mrs


Taylor will send home further details.
