
Every week, one of our Influencers will recommend a book for others to read, so look out for their recommendations in our weekly newsletter.

Every child has been allocated 2 seats, per performance, to allow all of the children's parents to attend. We do appreciate that many of our grandparents will be disappointed not to be able to attend, but seats have to be restricted due to health and safety reasons and the hall capacity has been reduced by the stage.

In previous years we have paid to have the production recorded, but we were so disappointed with the quality of the recording that we are reluctant to professionally record the production again. Other companies that we have looked into are very expensive and we are conscious that Christmas is an expensive time of year already. With this in mind, a member of staff will record the production on an

IPAD, and we are happy to put our copy of the performance onto a pen drive for you, if you send a named one in. Please bear in mind though, that this will not be a professional recording - it will simply be a live record of the show. We look forward to seeing you all on Tues/Wed next week. Just sign in at the office. Please don't come too early as we need time to set up the hall after lunch. Doors will only open at 2.20pm.

There is no KS2 Christmas Play this year. We are planning to have a summer production instead.


