We choose to hold the panto in school in order to keep costs down, as coach transport and theatre ticket prices are so expensive.

School is aware of the financial challenges that many of our families are facing, at this time, and with this in mind, the PTFA have agreed to help fund the cost of the panto with school and with you—the families. This means that we are asking for a donation of £2.50 per child. Payment streams are set up on School Money and we ask that all contributions are paid by Wednesday 13th December. Thank you.

We hold the panto as part of our Christmas Day of Fun as it really makes it a day to remember for the children. As part of this day, the children are able to come to school dressed up in a Christmassy way - or they can even come dressed up as a character from our panto Aladdin.
