Year 1 National Curriculum Objectives for Geography: Children will be taught to:

Geographical enquiry and skills.

- Ask simple geographical questions e.g. What is Blackpool like?
- Observe and record e.g. weather in Billinge; shop use in Billinge; different types of houses
- Express their own views and opinions about Blackpool and Billinge. E.g. How can we improve Billinge? Where would you rather live and why?
- Demonstrate their geographical knowledge and understanding through writing, art, maps, pictures and graphs e.g. post cards from Blackpool; pictograms to show different shops in Billinge
- Use geographical vocabulary that is linked to their area of study
- Use primary and secondary sources of information to carry out simple research e.g. use photographs of Blackpool to discover what tourist attractions are there
- Draw a route map to show their journey through Billinge
