"I like computers because I don't have one at home." Children requested longer computing lessons.

"Make lessons longer because we don't always finish."

"It's a fun way to learn about your topics."

"When your Miss says well done to you." (How children know they have made progress.)

A few of the children interviewed said they would like a bigger cyberlab.

"If I get stuck, I sit and have a little think." "I don't like coding: it's really complicated and a bit boring."

Computing is taught in school because it is helpful in life.

Children said they learn about computing to help them get jobs when they're older.

What our children said ...

Children commented on how they recap prior learning, which helps them see how far they've come.

We learn computing,
"Because we don't
want to end up like our
parents are now!"

Children commented that sometimes, they go up to the cyberlab in two halves. One half stays in class and completes a different lesson, and the other half do computing. Then, they swap.

"The computers take ages to come on. They're so old."

"I like Education City because you get certificates." When they struggle in computing, children mentioned having another go and then asking the teacher for guidance.

Purple Mash was popular with children:

"It's learning in a fun way."

Children mentioned that computing lessons are useful so that they will understand the basics when new technology comes out.

Children mentioned that computing is good because they can continue their learning at home by logging in on their own devices.
