

We are planning to hold our annual sports day on Tuesday 18th June 2024.

We run Sports Day as two separate events - Infants and Juniors - both held on the same day.



The Junior event will start at 10.00am and should end by midday. The Infant session will run from 2.00pm—3.15pm.

Hopefully the sun will shine and Sports Day will take place on the date above. However, as we all know, we can't always rely on

the weather and so we have set aside Tuesday 25th June 2024 as the reserve date. We only set aside 2 possible dates for Sports Day as we know from parental feedback that it is difficult to keep changing holiday requests at the last minute when school has to cancel due to poor weather. It is also very difficult to keep more than 2 dates clear in our busy summer calendar.

If the weather is unkind on both days, there are no further available dates in the school diary and therefore the event would not go ahead.

Parents have asked why we do not move Sports Day inside if the weather is bad and the answer is that it is simply not possible to run a multi sport event inside our halls, as they are not big enough to hold the children and parents—let alone all of the equipment. Running the event in classes would take too many days and would need parents to seek more than 1 day off in order to attend.

If the event is cancelled, the children take part in Sports Day activities as part of their planned PE lessons, so they do not miss out on the events.

Further details will be sent home nearer to the time. We just wanted to give you as much time as possible to provisionally book the dates off work.











As part of the day, the children learned about the importance of teamwork and co-operation when they had to work together to build the tallest free standing tower possible using giant Meccano kits.


