Y6 SATs Week

We want to say a big WELL DONE to our Y6 children who sat their SATs tests this week. The children were amazing - showing perseverance and determination when questions challenged them, and working methodically and carefully through all test papers.

We couldn't be more proud of them all and we really hope that all of their hard work preparing for the SATs pays off and that the children get the results they deserve.

Results will be released on Tuesday 11th July. The children ended their SATs week with a class party and a great time was had by all.





Swimming for all Y4 children and some Y5 children, who are non swimmers, will start on Friday 17th June and will take place every Friday until Friday 12th July.

All children must wear appropriate swimwear as set by the baths and the LA swim instructors.

Girls must wear a one-piece swimsuit (no two-piece, single-shoulder or frills at all). Boys must wear swimming trunks or shorts of no longer than mid-thigh length (no Bermudas or long shorts are acceptable as these can become dangerous when the pockets become full of water). Goggles can be worn, but are discouraged. All long hair must be tied up or a swimming cap can be worn (regardless of your child's gender).

If your child would prefer it, an appropriate swim top and shorts can be worn rather than the traditional trunks/swimming costumes. Please note that the swim top/shorts must be of recognised swim wear material - it cannot be a t-shirt and shorts.

For hygiene reasons, children should not come to school wearing their swimwear underneath their tracksuits. Also, time at the baths is limited, so children will not have the time to wash their hair or shower after the session. The children simply need a towel, their swimwear and maybe a brush/comb. These should be brought into school in either a plastic bag or swim bag.

As swimming is a statutory part of the National Curriculum and is an essential life skill, all children are expected to attend every session unless there is a medical reason as to why they cannot attend. Details of medical reasons should be sent into school.

School pays for the hire of the baths and for the coach journey to and from the pool so there is not cost to parents/carers.


